An international conference on Advances in Textiles, Machinery, Nonwoven and Technical Textiles ATNT-2008, will be held in Coimbatore, popularly known as 'Manchester of South India' from July 14-16, 2008. It is jointly organized by Textiles and Clothing Department of Avinashilingam University for Women, Coimbatore, India and The Institute of Environmental and Human Health, Texas Tech University, USA. The main theme of the conference will focus on the emerging and cutting-edge advancements in the frontier areas of Textiles, Machinery, Nonwoven and Technical Textiles. A special feature of the conference is its emphasis on the entire value-chain of textiles, from fiber to fashion fabric, and apparel fabric to technical textiles.

India is emerging as a textile and manufacturing powerhouse with enormous growth opportunities. With the burgeoning middle-class population over 300 million; there will be an explosion of textile material usage in all sorts of applications, providing a huge market for global textile players. India is a preferred place for multinationals to venture into a myriad of business opportunities including nonwoven, medical, technical textiles and apparels.

The timing and venue of the conference are ideal for global players in academia and industry to assemble in India for the fifth time since 2004. India is rising in nonwoven and technical textiles with several supportive initiatives for the industry and research organizations to venture into technical textiles. The Prime Minister of India has launched National Technology Mission on Technical Textiles to promote research and development and the growth of the nascent technical textiles industry

in India. International academia and industry have opportunities in India for research and business collaborations.

ORGANISERS

The conference is an international collaborative endeavor between Avinashilingam University for Women, India and The Institute of Environmental and Human Health (TIEHH), Texas Tech University, USA. Avinashilingam University for Women was founded by Sri T. S. Avinashilingam in the year 1957 as Sri Avinashilingam Home Science College for Women.

Sri T.S. Avinashilingam an eminent educationist, a true visionary, well known social reformer, an advocate of women's emancipation and a great institution builder, was the first Chancellor of the University when the institution attained Deemed university status in 1988. His noble visions touched the realm of reality through the dedicated perseverance of the first Vice-Chancellor Dr. Rajammal P. Devadas, the world-renowned nutritionist and an educationalist.

The University follows the educational ideals of Sri Ramakrishna, Holy Mother Sri Saradhamani Devi , Swami Vivekanandha and Mahatma Gandhiji. The institution aims at empowering women through education incorporating a curriculum that is both need based and holistic. Swami Vivekanadha observed that education is not the mere acquisition of bookish knowledge. It is the development of human personality. Keeping this in mind, all the activities of the University take off from a strong foundation of ethical values, principles and cater to the development of all students be it physical, intellectual, and spiritual. In the short time, scientists at TIEHH, in collaboration with faculty at TTU and TTUHSC, have created a unique multidisciplinary research and academic program working to find answers to real-world issues related to the effects of toxins on the environment and human health. Located at Reese Technology Centre in Lubbock, TX, USA, TIEHH is also committed to stimulating the area's economic development through it's almost \$50 million in research grants and contracts facilitated through TIEHH since its establishment, creating close to \$200 million dollars of economic impact.

Within TIEHH, the Division of Nonwoven and Advanced Materials was established to focus on and facilitate the development of value-added nonwoven and novel materials to enhance human life such as defense textiles and bio-based automotive textiles. Nanotechnology-based research activities focus on

nanoparticles for environmental contamination remediation, nanofiber filters and bioengineered nanomaterials for human health improvements. TIEHH is the first academic facility in the USA to house, H1 technology needlepunching machine. Students involved in advanced materials research also graduate with MS and Ph.D degrees in Environmental Toxicology, which is also housed through TIEHH, as it is rated the leading environmental academic program in USA.

CONFERENCE VENUE - THE COIMBATORE CITY

Coimbatore city, is situated in the western part of Tamil Nadu and is also the district headquarter, which is known for its textile industries with many foundries, machinery and accessories manufacturers. A number of textile spinning, weaving, garment and textile machinery manufacturing industries are located in and around the city. Coimbatore is also famous for its good academic infrastructure with a number of colleges offering courses in textiles and allied subjects. The city is located at 432 meters above the mean sea level and is in the foothills of the Western Ghat mountains. It enjoys an excellent climate throughout the year. It is well connected by air and surface transport. Coimbatore is surrounded by major tourist spots and has always been a natural favorite with international tourists. Scenic hill stations of Ooty and Munnar and Arcot, the historic temples of Perur and Palani and the nearby exciting Kerala with its enchanting back-waters and health and holiday resorts resorts are all a couple of hours drive from Coimbatore. Coimbatore has hosted four international conferences in textiles since 2004, which have attracted over 1250 people cumulatively from many different parts of the world. Leading industrialists and scientists from USA, UK, Germany, Czech Republic, Japan, Portugal, Switzerland, Hong Kong, Turkey and Pakistan have visited these conferences and have made them internationally known.
